



One of the keyboard giants of our time, Mieczysław Horszowski has been a world-famous figure since he was five years old, when he amazed European critics with his performance from memory of the Inventions of J.S. Bach. He made his New York debut in Carnegie Hall at the age of fourteen, by which time he was already a veteran of the concert hall, having made several tours of Europe, played as soloist with the foremost symphony orchestras, and given a recital before Pope Pius X. While still a child prodigy he attracted the attention of composers of such stature as Szymanowski and Ravel, both of whom invited Horszowski to participate in joint concerts of their works. With his great devotion he has given himself unstintingly to the performances of the great masters of the past and present. He has, for example, enriched the musical life of New York by presenting the entire piano literature of Beethoven in twelve concerts, all the piano sonatas in eight concerts and he has presented Mozart piano sonata cycles on several occasions in four concerts.

Unlike the many prodigies who fail to fulfill their early promise, Horszowski has shown throughout his career a continuous development of his ample gifts, and, far from succumbing to the many pitfalls of early fame, has dedicated himself with humble and unswerving devotion to the service of the music he loves, searching always for deeper understanding of the great composers' intentions. Never has he sacrificed artistic integrity for immediate effect, or used music as a vehicle for personal showmanship.

No musician has been more esteemed by his colleagues; Mr. Horszowski played repeatedly under the baton of Arturo Toscanini and partnered Pablo Casals in recital in innumerable concert halfs, before crowned heads, in the White House and at the United Nations.

Today Mieczysław Horszowski pursues an active concert career around the globe — playing recitals, appearing with orchestras and performing chamber music with todays's leading artists. He is also busily recording the entire Well-Tempered Clavier of Bach as his special legacy to the world. In demand on both sides of the Atlantic for his celebrated masterclasses, he shares his summers with students at Marlboro in Vermont, in Lucerne and Zermatt and at the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki.

To his young students and admirers Mieczyslaw Horszowski is a walking compendium of musical history — a bridge between the historic names of the early part of the century and the present.
